

Camp Wanapitei Accessibility Policy

Camp Wanapitei accepts people with disabilities at any time at the base camp in Temagami, ON and at our programs operating out of the Wanapitei Chateau. On our wilderness canoe trips, persons with disabilities are welcome and encouraged to participate. As with any participant, Wanapitei directors take into account a person's paddling and portaging ability when considering participation on a Wanapitei canoe trip expedition.

Persons with a disability can expect the following from Camp Wanapitei administration and staff members.

1. Adaptations for communication. Camp Wanapitei considers a person's disability when choosing methods of communication.
2. Accessibility devices. Camp Wanapitei accepts devices like wheelchairs (need to be all-terrain), walkers and other assistive devices at our site in Temagami. Furthermore, Camp Wanapitei will assist people with physical disabilities if they need motorized transit on our very rugged site.
3. Service Animals. Camp Wanapitei allows service animals at all programs at the main site and considers service animals on wilderness canoe trips.
4. Support Persons. Camp Wanapitei accepts support persons for people with disabilities at all programs and events at the main site and will consider support persons on a wilderness canoe trip.
5. Limitations. Camp Wanapitei communicates openly with any person with disabilities regarding certain programs and limitations to accessibility and/or accessible services.

Training

Staff training provides training regarding accessible customer service.

Camp Wanapitei leaders are trained with respect to the specific disability of a person in their care (i.e. hearing impaired, learning disability)
